#### Words you'll hear at the dentist, and what they mean.

Amalgam is the silver or white stuff used to fill a cavity.

<u>Caries</u> is a cavity, or a hole in the tooth caused by decay. Decay happens when the bacteria in your mouth eat the sugar on your teeth and then release acids that attack the tooth enamel.

Sugar Bugs a pediatric dentist will often refer to the bacteria and plaque in your child's mouth as the "sugar bugs".

Pedodontist, or pediatric dentist is a dentist for children.

Oral Health is the health of the mouth, teeth and gums.

<u>Fluoride Varnish</u> is made with fluoride, a mineral that can strengthen tooth enamel (outer coating on teeth). It is brushed onto the top and sides of each tooth.

<u>Plaque</u> is areas of bacteria that are hard and stuck to the tooth and cause decay. The dental hygienist gently removes plaque from teeth during cleaning.

# How to Safely Dispose of Expired or Unwanted Medicine

#### **Disposal Kiosk Sites**

Many pharmacies and law enforcement agencies have disposal kiosks where you can get rid of unwanted, unused, or expired over-the-counter (OTC) and prescription medicines. To find a kiosk site near you, check out this locator on <a href="MyOldMeds.com">MyOldMeds.com</a>.





#### In-Home Disposal

If there is not a kiosk located near you, follow these simple steps to dispose of OTC and most prescription medicines in your household trash:



Remove the medicines from their original containers\* and mix them with something undesirable, such as used coffee grounds, dirt, or cat litter.



Put the mixture in something you can close, like a sealed plastic bag.



Throw the container in the trash.

\* Be sure to scratch out all your personal information on the empty medicine packaging or bottle to protect your identity and privacy before throwing it away.

#### Should My Medicine Be Flushed?

The U.S. Food & Drug Administration (FDA) has a flush list for specific medicines that should be flushed down the toilet if a disposal kiosk is not available. View the list on FDA's website.
